<u>Don'ts</u>

There are always many points to note. You should not copy large chunks of text from the book. You should not try to write everything down. Moreover, don't write too many sentences but use keywords and concepts. More importantly, as every student has a different way of learning, another person's method may not be suitable for you, so don't blindly follow what other friends or classmates do.

Other information

I suggest you use mind maps to help you conclude a chapter. Also, when the memory of the lesson is still fresh in your mind, it is better for you to clarify what you have learnt by making notes so that you can refresh your memory quicker when you do revision in the future. It helps you to save time too.
